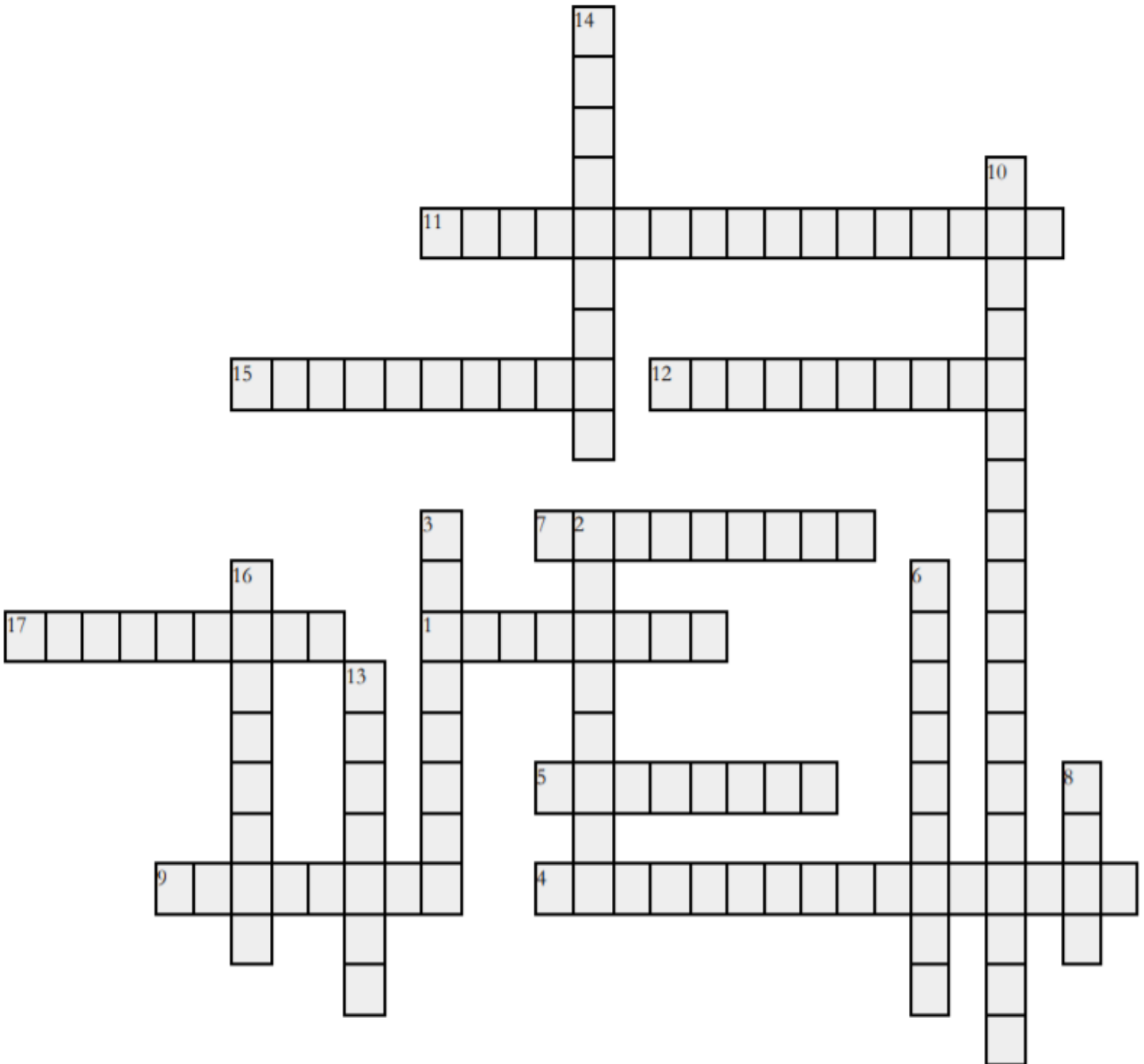


Food Web Crossword
